Our Loutet Farm is entering its second season as your neighbourhood farm! With soil, fencing and an irrigation system already installed, we're well ahead of where we were a year ago. and are already watching the garlic sprouting on the farm. We are hopeful that we will be able to add two bee hives which will allow us to add delicious North Shore honey to our market days! Crop planning is complete and seeds are sprouting in the hoophouse -- they will soon find their way into the soil. Come by any time to check out their progress - the farm is always open to the public. We are excited to be preparing to install (long overdue!) signage at the farm to give everyone a little more information about what is happening on the farm.

Watch the website for Loutet market dates & times (www.ediblegardenproject.com). These will likely begin in June, depending on how the spring season is! We look forward to sharing what we grow!

Unfortunately, farmer Robbie will be moving on from the farm to work and return to school -- he will be missed! We will be welcoming a new farmer in the coming weeks.

We have set aside two volunteer days for GBRRA volunteers: Saturday, April 28th, 1-3pm, and Wednesday, May 16th, 5:30-7pm to try your hand at farming -- bring your rubber boots and dress for the weather - all tools will be supplied.



Low Level Road Improvement Project

The biggest federal project ever to hit North Vancouver is coming to a neighbourhood near you. The Port Metro Vancouver (PMV) is putting things in place to expand its operations and encroach within 10 feet (in some areas) on private residents' homes that sit adjacent to the bluff above Low Level Road. What was presented to the public as a Low Level Road 'Improvement' Project is really a PMV and CN Rail expansion. This project, currently in the public consultation phase, will effect hundreds of homes in the vicinity. The project includes the raising of Low Level Road, the installation of two more rail tracks and the building of two significant overpasses into Port lands. Together, these will increase pollution -- noise and dust will rise further up the hill, and during construction major roadways may be closed, resulting in traffic issues for up to 3 years. A small neighbourhood in the 500 & 600 block of East 1st Street has been involved in this for over a year. and residents have committed many hours researching how the entire community will be greatly affected.
