Save the date! GBRRA will be holding it's 5th annual Urban Agriculture Workshop from 11:00 to 3:00 pm, with the help of the farmers of the Edible Garden Project. We are inviting you to spread the word about our very own LOUTET FARM to your secondary students and adults, young and old. We'll introduce participants to a few aspects of growing vegetables: in your back yard, in a raised garden, or in your kitchen, sprouting alfalfa seeds or wheat grass. You'll learn about pollinator bees, bee boxes and the flowers that attract bees. There's also a 'Chicken Lady' who will Show & Tell about keeping backyard chickens.

#### The Green Necklace

The Green Necklace was first envisioned by Edward Mahon, one of the first land owners of North Vancouver. Mahon stated: "Completion of this great public way... would perpetuate health areas and pleasure grounds within a short distance of every resident". The original plan shows Grand Blvd. going north to 25th Street. west to Jones Ave. and south to Mahon Park and West Keith Rd. To date, the Official Community Plan of the City of North Vancouver is committed to "honouring and maintaining Mahon's vision of a necklace of green spaces". In 2005, the first phase was completed through Victoria Park, east of Lonsdale and on East Keith Road to St. Andrews Ave. Phase 2 was on Jones Ave. from West Keith Rd. to West 21st St. Phase 3, presently under construction, continues along East Keith Rd. to Grand Boulevard. Two asphalt paths were created on each side of the Boulevard for bicycles (west side, northbound; east side, southbound) and the centre walking path was also paved. This leads to Boulevard Crescent, with bike paths that will continue north on Lynn Valley Rd. Last October, Council approved spending \$50,000 for greenways down St. David's and Queensbury, connecting the Green Necklace with the waterfront Spirit Trail.

In addition to the Green Necklace, the City of North Vancouver received provincial funding for a pedestrian path and a separate bike path going up West Keith Road from Marine Dr. to Chesterfield Ave. Cyclists going downhill on West Keith Rd. must share the lane with cars. The goal of the City is to encourage people to get out of their cars and reduce congestion on our streets, by walking or cycling for short trips.

# YOUNG ENTREPRENEURSHIP AND LEADERSHIP LAUNCHPAD (YELL)

One of the keys to success in business is networking and mentoring. The YELL offers students entering Grades 11 and 12 a dynamic and engaging forum to explore the field of business in a real-world setting.

Students earn course credit toward graduation while working with teachers and business/community leaders to design a business. They connect with top entrepreneurial talent and compete in a Venture Challenge in the spring.

Hosted at Sutherland Secondary School, students with an interest in business from Carson Graham, Handsworth and Argyle Secondary Schools are welcome to apply. The course runs outside the regular timetable, with weekly 2½-hour classes or meetings from September to December. In January, students will break into mentorship groups, working towards "Venture Presentation Night", during which they will share their business ideas and learning.

- Mentorship opportunities with business partners in the community
- Opportunity to develop their own business ideas
- Opportunity to develop public speaking, leadership and collaboration skills
